

- a good opportunity to show that life satisfaction and well-being are part of the positive life strategies instead of sticking to survival strategies.
 - Do not waste a good crisis the banking crisis in Europe shows that with quick fixes we avoid fundamental changes

the future we (do not) want

- we know what sustainability is how to get there, how to implement social and cultural change. We do not know what people want and willing to do, what is politically feasible for the most marginalised communities
- research needs to defragment across levels
